Mike Paulin, 204 SW Blvd, New Plymouth. Asked what amount will this development increase the city services fees?

Superintendent Beau Ziemer: The developer will pay for all sewer and water upgrades. The builder/owner of each property pays for the water/sewer hook-up fees.

Suzie Jones, 160 SW Blvd, New Plymouth. She has a concern with the safety of the increased street traffic. What will be done to assure that is addressed?

Superintendent Beau Ziemer: There will be a public hearing held when the developers submit their Preliminary Plat which is when the discussion regarding road safety can be addressed.

Sean Conner with the developer group answered saying that when they get to that step in the project there will be a traffic study done. They had already been discussing the idea of a speed hump to help slow down traffic.

Sean Conner with the developer answered saying they are projecting 175 homes. That the project will be from the city limits to Adams Rd.
