- a. Payette County Impact Fees (Discussion) Ozzie Gripentrog from Galena & Adam Gonzales from Payette County addressed the council regarding the collection of impact fees for Payette County. The purpose of the impact fee is for growth to pay for growth. There will be follow up discussions on the impact fees at a later date.
- b. EKC Final Payment & Liquidated Damages (Action Item) City Engineer Andy Gehrke recommends approval of final payment less liquidated damages. The options for the liquidated damages have been included in the letter provided by Heco. Discussion between council.
 Councilman Warnke made a motion to pick option 4 Waive liquidated damages and pay the full retainage amount. The city would pay the contractor \$23,246.02 for Application for payment #10. Motion dies for lack of a second. Councilman Warnke made a motion to pick option 3 Reduce the

final payment amount by the Substantial Completion liquidated damages amount of \$15,500.00. The city would pay the contractor \$7,746.02 for application for Payment #10.
