The regular meeting of the New Plymouth City Council was held at the New Plymouth City Hall on Tuesday, February 17, 2009 at 7:00 p.m. Mayor Cook, Councilmen Cline, York, Esplin and Councilwoman Mayer were present.

Guests included Dallas Hawker, Doug Erickson, Andy Gerhke and Beau Ziemer.

The agenda was presented to the Council. <u>Councilman York made the motion to approve the agenda with the addition of "Dallas Hawker" to item "b" under "Old Business".</u>
Councilman Esplin seconded the motion, which met with full approval.

The consent agenda was presented to the Council.
